WHEREAS, the Berlin Borough Board of Education, pursuant to the Contract of Employment between the Berlin Borough Board of Education and Kristen Martello, Article VI, Section C, "has the authority to relieve the Superintendent of the performance of his/her duties, so long as it continues to pay his/her salary and benefits for the duration of the term"; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Berlin Borough Board of Education hereby places Kristen Martello on administrative leave, with salary and benefits.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that as a result of the administrative leave it is the intention of the Berlin Borough Board of Education that Kristen Martello not be permitted to enter upon any district property, except to retrieve personal items under escort of the School Resource Officer.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all property of the District belonging to Kristen Martello, including but not limited to the District's iPad, badge and keys are to be immediately returned to the School Resource Officer, and district files may be accessed effective immediately.
